

ADVENT WORSHIP LITURGY SET





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Welcome to the In Light & Darkness Worship Liturgy. The inspiration for our theme comes from the common usage of "light" and "darkness" during Advent and from exploring how the earth experiences both the very lightest and darkest days with summer and winter solstices during Advent. Scripture focusing on God's light has led to the belief light is the source of goodness and hope. This belief implies darkness is not wanted or needed, it is something to banish or get rid of, or God is not even present in the dark.

Barbara Brown Taylor's book, *Learning to Walk in the Dark*, helps us reimagine our understanding of darkness, primarily how Christianity heavily relies on the binary construct of light as good and darkness as bad. Taylor proposes that the pair of light and dark co-exist in balance, not opposition. She asks, "What can light possibly mean without dark?"

We hope our In Light and Darkness-themed materials will help you share conversations about your understanding of light and darkness. We encourage you to explore how those understandings influence how you view God, your faith, and the world.

These Advent and Christmas Liturgies are written to tie in An Illustrated Advent for Families: In Light and Darkness and In Light and Darkness: An Advent Devotional (both the Illustrated and Text-only Editions) for a fully In Light and Darkness-themed Advent. At the same time, these liturgies can be used by themselves, apart from the devotionals. Feel free to tweak the prayers and litanies to work for your worship leaders and community.

^{*} We substituted Hymn Recommendations (listed throughout the service) for the Communion Liturgy in the Candlelight Service. If you would like to include a Communion Liturgy, you can use the one within the Children and Families Service.



The Children and Families Service is written for Christmas Eve or Christmas Day, fully acknowledging and celebrating the birth of Jesus, but may be adapted to other calendar dates. Adjust the Advent Wreath Lighting to the appropriate candles and adjust verb tenses to suit the story you are telling during that service. It is customary to light the Christ candle and say, "Merry Christmas," on the evenings of December 24 and 25.

The Candlelight Service is written for Christmas Eve. Still, it may also be adapted to other calendar dates with slight adjustments to tenses, replacing "Christmas Eve" with "Advent" or "Christmas Time" depending on how your faith community divides the seasons.

$\c L$ BEST PRACTICES FOR SHARING ILLUSTRATED MINISTRY'S RESOURCES

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We've found there are three good ways to share our files with your community:

Email: Depending on the size of your congregation, we encourage you to email files to those who want to use the resource. Another option is to put an announcement in your bulletin, asking those interested in receiving the files to email the person with access to the resource.

Note: Please do not include attachments or links to download our files in any emails/newsletters that are posted publicly online with services like Mailchimp, Constant Contact, etc. Links of this nature are searchable by Google, and the files can quickly become accessible to the general public.

Posting Online: We do not want the general public to have access to our products free of charge. We discourage posting our files online because they become easily accessible through Google searches. However, one option is to put the files on a password-protected page of your website, or use a private Facebook Group. Please remember to take the files down after you've finished using them.

Note: Please do not post the password in a bulletin or newsletter that is posted publicly online.

Print: Most congregations who purchase our digital files choose to print out the materials. Printing the materials is probably the easiest way to share the resources with your community.

Begin with the Words of Institution commonly used in your tradition, and then you can use the below prayer:

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith.

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Let us pray:

Holy Spirit, unite us in Christ's mission.

Help us care for one another and for our community,

until love and justice reign and we feast at his heavenly banquet together.
